Except with regard to those candidates who have studied from 8 th Standard Onwards and have undergone undergraduate course (B.H.M.S.) in Tamil Nadu, others seeking Admission should furnish Nativity Certificate in the Format as in Annexure – I
3	All enclosures prescribed should be Self – Attested true photocopies only. The Originals should be produced only at the time of Counselling and Admission.
4	Application with incomplete or insufficient particulars or without enclosures or those received after the last date mentioned will be summarily rejected. Further, request for extension of time for submission of documents beyond the prescribed date and time shall not be entertained under any circumstances.
5	Applications received by speed post, courier or any other means after the last date and time will not be accepted irrespective of the date of booking.
6	Non-service candidates should send their applications directly to the Secretary, Selection Committee Office.
7	Service candidates should forward their Application only through the proper channel with the remarks of the forwarding authorities in the format prescribed in the Application form. It should compulsorily reach on or before the last date as mentioned above. 15	ALLOTMENT OF SEATS: The Selection Committee will allot seats to the Branches of study based on the merit and following 200 points roster based upon the seat matrix provided by the affiliating University the Tamil Nadu Dr. MGR Medical University and subject to the availability of seats at the time of individual's turn. Apportionment of seats between the Government and Management of Self Financing Minority Institutions is in the ratio of 50:50 of the 85% of the Sanctioned strength of seats after surrendering 15% of the sanctioned strength of seats towards All India Quota (AIQ).

Candidates who have completed CRRI or will be completing CRRI before Counseling of are alone eligible to apply for Post Graduate Degree Course in Homoeopathy. Further, the candidate should have appeared in AIAPGET 2022 (HOMOEOPATHY) and should have secured a place in the common merit list arrived at by MoA / NTA AIAPGET 2022 (HOMOEOPATHY).</p>
17	<p>At the time of counseling, candidate should produce the Original documents such as the II Provisional Certificate or Degree Certificate from the recognized University and Medical Registration Certificate issued by NCH / Tamil Nadu Homoeopathy Medical Council, Chennai.</p>
18	<p>The Candidate should be a Citizen of India and should have undergone B.H.M.S. Course in the State of Tamil Nadu. Candidates of Tamil Nadu nativity who have completed B.H.M.S. Course in other States shall furnish a Certificate of Nativity in Tamil Nadu issued by a competent authority only in the specified format prescribed in the application (See Annexure – I),and should also produce the Eligibility Certificate from the T.N. 27	Candidate can opt for waiting list only for the speciality and not the College. The candidate cannot claim the seat which was present during Phase I during his/or her turn, in Subsequent phases.																																																
28	Candidates seeking admission to Homoeopathy PG Degree course for the academic session 2022-2023 shall have to qualify All India AYUSH Post Graduate Entrance Test 2022 (Homoeopathy). It shall be necessary for the candidates to obtain minimum of marks at 50 th percentile in AIAPGET 2022 (HOMOEOPATHY). However in respect of candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Castes(Arunthathiyar), Scheduled Tribes, Backward Classes, Backward Classes (Muslim), Most Backward Classes and Denotified Community, the Minimum marks shall be at 40 th Percentile in AIAPGET 2022 (HOMOEOPATHY). In respect of candidates with locomotor disability of lower limb only the minimum marks shall be at 45 th percentile for General Category candidates and 40 th Percentile for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Castes(Arunthathiyar), Scheduled Tribes, Backward Classes, Backward Classes (Muslim), Most Backward Classes and Denotified Community candidates.

32	Allotment of College / Branches will be made at the time of Counselling to be conducted by the Selection Committee at the campus of the Arignar Anna Government Hospital of Indian Medicine, Arumbakkam, Chennai 106 based on marks obtained by the candidates in the AIAPGET 2022 (HOMOEOPATHY) and Experience marks taken together. College / Branch once opted and allotted to the candidates at the time of Counselling cannot be changed subsequently under any circumstances.
33	The Post Graduate Degree course M.D (Homoeopathy) admissions for 2022-2023 session will close on the cut off date of admission as prescribed by the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University for the academic year 2022-2023.

Candidates above 50 years as on 31-08-2022 are not eligible to apply.</p> <p>(ii) Homoeopathy Medical Graduates who are approved Probationers and who are working. as</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Medical Officers working (continuously for two years) in Local Bodies in Tamil Nadu. A doctor absorbed from the Panchayat Union into Government Service as per G.O.
