1.	Application for admission to Post Graduate Courses in Yoga & Naturopathy 2023-2024 session in Govt. Yoga & Naturopathy Medical College, Chennai, and International Institute of Yoga & Naturopathy Medical Sciences, Chengalpattu can be downloaded from the official website: <a href="http://www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in">www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in</a> . Also, Candidates are advised to read the prospectus carefully before filling the application form. No correspondence / request for re-consideration will be entertained.
2.	Any change or modification and relevant information pertaining to this admission process will be made available only on the website: <a href="http://www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in">www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in</a>
3.	The candidates are instructed to visit the website at least two times a day for updates from the date of issue of application till the end of admission process without fail. Selection Committee will not be responsible for consequences resulting due to non-diligent follow-up of notification and publications appearing on the website regarding admission to Post Graduate Degree courses 2023-2024 session.
4.	Admission to Post Graduate Courses in Yoga & Naturopathy will be made purely on merit, based on the marks obtained in the Entrance Examination that will be conducted by the Selection Committee, Directorate of Indian Medicine and Homoeopathy together with the post BNYS / ND experience marks. Tentatively Entrance Exam will be conducted on <b>Announce in Website <a href="http://www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in">www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in</a> shortly</b> and venue of the Entrance Exam will be announced by the Selection Committee, Arignar Anna Govt. Hospital of Indian Medicine Campus, Chennai-106. All Candidates who apply for the Post Graduate M.D (Y&N) course should remit a <b>non-refundable amount of Rs.3000/- (Rupees Three Thousand only)</b> towards Application Cost, through SBI e-Collect. The candidates belonging to SC/SCA/ST are exempted from paying application cost.

6.	All Candidates who participate in the counselling will have to remit a non-refundable amount of Rs.1000/- (Rupees One Thousand only) by <b>CASH only</b> , as processing fee for attending counselling.	
7.	<p><b>PAYMENT OF COURSE FEE DEPOSIT:</b></p> <p>The candidates who are selected at the time of counseling shall remit a <b>non-refundable sum of Rs.5,000/- (Rupees Five Thousand only)</b> by CASH only. After the receipt of the joining report from the Principal of the Govt. Yoga &amp; Naturopathy Medical College, Chennai and International Institute of Yoga &amp; Naturopathy Medical Sciences, Chengalpattu this amount will be transferred to the Colleges to get adjusted with the Tuition Fees to be paid by the candidates. If the candidate fails to join the course after getting allotment order within the stipulated time, he/she will forfeit this amount as well as seat allotted.</p>	

## **I. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS**

1.	Before filling up of the downloaded application Form, carefully read all the instructions given in Prospectus and fill the Application Form carefully and legibly without overwriting in one's own hand writing. Application with incomplete or insufficient particulars or without enclosures or those received after the last date mentioned will be summarily rejected.
2.	All enclosures prescribed shall be Self-attested photocopies only as per clause. The originals should be produced only at the time of Counselling and Admission.
3.	Applications received by Speed Post / Courier or any other means after the last date and time will not be accepted, irrespective of the date of booking.
4.	Non-service candidates should send their applications directly to the Secretary, Selection Committee office, Directorate of Indian Medicine and Homoeopathy, Chennai – 600 106.
5.	Service candidates should forward their Application only through the proper channel with the remarks of the forwarding authorities in the format prescribed in the application form to the Secretary, Selection Committee, Directorate of Indian Medicine and Homoeopathy. It should compulsorily reach on or before the last date as mentioned above. If not, applications will be summarily rejected irrespective of the date of submission by the applicant and date of forwarding by the competent authority. Advance copies from the service candidates will not be accepted.
6.	A self-attested recent passport size photograph should be affixed in the front page of the application form in the space provided. One recent passport size photograph in the identification-cum-attendance card and two recent passport size photographs in the hall tickets should be affixed in the space provided.
7.	If a candidate desires an immediate acknowledgement, he/she should advise the postal or courier service and pay the required fee themselves. On assigning Application Register number (A.R. No.) for all the applicants, a list of prima facie eligible candidates will be uploaded in our website <b>www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in</b> along with the corresponding Application Register Number (A.R. ## II. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

10.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• A Pass in BNYS Regular Degree course conducted by the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University / any other University recognized by UGC under regular stream or a pass in N.D.(Osm) under regular stream.</li><li>• <b>Should have successfully completed the Compulsory Rotatory Resident Internship (CRRI) and should have registered their names with the Tamil Nadu Board of Indian Medicine, Chennai-106 well before the Day of Entrance Examination for Admission to M.D. (Y &amp; N) Courses for 2023-2024 session.</b></li></ul>
11.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Candidate should be a Citizen of India and a Native of Tamil Nadu and or should have undergone B.N.Y.S Degree course in the State of Tamil Nadu.</li><li>• Candidates of Tamil Nadu nativity who have completed the B.N.Y.S /N. D (Osm) Course in other States shall furnish a Nativity certificate of having his / her nativity in Tamil Nadu issued by the competent authority only in the Annexure I format prescribed along with the Application and should also produce the Eligibility Certificate from the Tamil Nadu Dr. M. G. R. Medical university, Chennai before counselling or before attending the counselling.</li></ul>
12.	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>NOT ELIGIBLE</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Candidates who join a Post Graduate Degree in any branch and discontinue the course on any grounds after the cutoff date fixed by the Affiliating University <b>are not eligible to apply for two subsequent academic years.</b></li><li>• Candidates who have completed a Post Graduate Degree or the candidates who possess a Post Graduate Degree in one Specialty / Branch of study <b>are Not Eligible to apply for admission to any other Post Graduate degree i.e., in any other branches.</b></li><li>• Degree / Diploma in Yoga / Naturopathy obtained in distant mode / correspondence are not eligible. 3 years course in Naturopathy are also not eligible.</li></ul>

### III. DEFINITION OF SERVICE CANDIDATES & NON-SERVICE CANDIDATES

13.

#### SERVICE CANDIDATES

**The following categories of Yoga and Naturopathy Medical Graduates only will be treated as Service candidates and considered for selection against 50% of seats reserved exclusively for service candidates.**

(i) Yoga and Naturopathy Medical Graduates who were selected by the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission / Medical Services Recruitment Board and other regularized service candidates and appointed in the Tamil Nadu Medical Service on regular basis, who have put in minimum of TWO years satisfactory and continuous service excluding leave period such as Earned Leave, Unearned Leave on Medical Certificate, Unearned Leave on Private Affairs, Maternity Leave and any other unauthorized absence, as on 31.10.2023 either in Tamil Nadu Medical Service or local bodies and state organizations.

(ii) Yoga and Naturopathy Medical Graduates who are approved Probationers and who are working

a. As Medical Officers working (continuously for two years) in Local Bodies in Tamil Nadu. A doctor absorbed from the Panchayat Union into Government Service as per G.O.Ms. No 435 / H&/FW / IMI-2 Dept. dated: 23-11-2000 will be considered as Service Candidates provided that they should have completed 2 years of service.

b. In Government of India Institutions in the State

c. In Public Sector Undertaking and Organizations under the Control of Government of India in Tamil Nadu.

d. In undertaking or organization of Government of Tamil Nadu.

**Note:**

The candidates under Clause 13, sub clause (ii) item (a) to (d) above should give an undertaking to the concerned authorities that they will serve for 5 years in their respective institutions after the completion of course. They should produce a certificate from the concerned authority to show that they have given such an undertaking.

14.	<p><b><u>NON-SERVICE CANDIDATES</u></b></p> <p>The following category of Yoga and Naturopathy Medical Graduates will be treated as Non-Service Candidates.</p> <p>➤ Private Yoga &amp; Naturopathy Practitioners Registered under Tamil Nadu Board of Indian Medicine.</p>
15.	<p>The Examination Fee / other fee will be collected at the rate prescribed by the University from time to time</p>
<p><b><u>IV. MODE OF SELECTION AND ADMISSION</u></b></p>	
16.	<p><b>ENTRANCE EXAMINATION</b></p> <p>i. The Entrance Examination for admission to the Post Graduate M.D. (Yoga &amp; Naturopathy) course will be conducted as per existing Curriculum / Syllabus of the Tamil Nadu Dr. M. G. R. Medical University for BNYS Medical Degree Course.</p> <p>ii. <b>The Entrance Examination</b> will be covering all subjects and will contain <b>200 Objective type questions</b> each with four responses (A, B, C, D) in English.</p> <p>iii. <b>Each question will carry 0.5 (half) mark.</b> There will be NO NEGATIVE MARK for incorrect responses. No mark will be given for questions not answered. When more than one answer is indicated or when it is illegible, no mark will be awarded for that answer.</p>
17.	<p><b>i. Non-Service candidates:</b></p> <p>Admission to the course will be made purely on merit, based on the marks obtained in the entrance Examination.</p> <p>Maximum marks for written Entrance examination computed for – 100 marks.</p> <p><b>ii. Service – Candidates:</b></p> <p>Admission to the course will be made based on merit, based on the marks obtained in the entrance examination, and additional weightage marks awarded to eligible in – service candidates. One mark will be awarded for each computed year of Government service. Two marks will be awarded for each completed year of Government service in Hill areas and it will be limited to maximum of 10 marks, as per G.O.(Ms)No.320 Health and Family Welfare [IM 1-2] Dept., dated : 26.09.2023.</p>



18.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>i. Candidate should bring Hall Ticket at the time of examination.</li> <li>ii. An eligible candidate can get the Application Register Number i.e., A.R.No from the eligible list that will be uploaded in our website well before the Entrance Exam. Admission to the entrance examination will not confer any rights to the candidate for admission to the course if found ineligible later. Candidates will not be allowed to appear for the Entrance Examination unless he / she holds the Hall Ticket. The name, mailing address (in block letters) and passport size photographs in the hall ticket, in the identification slip and on the application form etc., should be one and the same.</li> <li>iii. The Hall Superintendent will verify the identity of the examinee with reference to his/her photograph affixed on the Identification card. The candidate will also be required to affix their signature in full as part of the identification process. Failure to follow instructions will result in expulsion of the candidate.</li> </ul>
19.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>i. The Entrance Examination for M.D. (Yoga &amp; Naturopathy) will be conducted <b>Announce in Website <a href="http://www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in">www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in</a> shortly</b> in one session of 3 hours duration at Arignar Anna Govt. Hospital of Indian Medicine Campus, Arumbakkam, Chennai - 600 106.</li> <li>ii. Candidates appearing for Entrance Examination will have to come to the Examination center at their own expense and make their own arrangements for stay.</li> <li>iii. Candidates should be present and seated in their allotted place as per their Application Register number, thirty minutes prior to the commencement of examination in order to fill up all examination particulars and identification verification.</li> <li>iv. Candidates coming 30 minutes after the commencement of the examination will not be permitted to take the examination.</li> <li>v. No candidate shall be allowed to carry any textual materials printed or written bits of paper, electronic and telecommunication gadgets and devices with or without remote sensing like cellular phones, Penscanners or electronic diary, Smart Watches etc. inside the examination hall.</li> <li>vi. No candidate shall be allowed to leave the Examination Hall before the end of half an hour after opening of question papers or one hour after commencement. Candidates shall not leave their seats even for using the Restroom without permission. Frequent visits to restroom may be avoided. Once a candidate leaves the Hall for any other reasons,</li> </ul>

	<p>he/she will not be permitted to re-enter the hall.</p> <p>vii. Candidate shall maintain strict silence in the examination hall. Any misconduct found out by the Hall Superintendent will result in the forfeiture of the right to continue the examination. His/ Her answer sheets will not be considered for valuation. Further he/she will not be allowed to apply for the PG course for two consecutive years. The decision of the Hall Superintendent in this connection shall be final.</p>
20.	<p>Answers should be shaded with their blue or black ball pen (NOT GEL), in the OMR sheets as per the instructions given in the OMR Sheet. There will be no rechecking, revaluation or recount of answer sheets. The Selection Committee's decision in this matter is final.</p>
21.	<p>The Question paper, Blank sheets (if any), OMR answer sheets, etc. are the property of the Committee and no part or whole shall be retained by a candidate under any circumstances. Any attempt to retain or take away these materials by a candidate shall be construed as serious misconduct and the candidate will be immediately disqualified and his/her paper will be seized and not evaluated.</p>
<p><b><u>V. COUNSELLING</u></b></p>	
22.	<p><b>Personal appearance during counselling along with All Original Certificates / Documents is compulsory for all candidates who attend counselling.</b> No separate letter for counselling will be issued after the announcement of results of the Entrance examination. Merit list arrived after the Entrance Exam will be uploaded in the website and in the notice board at the office of the Selection Committee, Directorate of Indian Medicine and Homoeopathy, Chennai-106. Candidates who are absent at the time of Counselling will not be considered for selection and also will not be permitted to attend any subsequent counselling and no request will be admitted in this regard at a later date.</p>
23.	<p><b>Candidates who secured less than 40% of total marks in case of OC, BC, BCM, MBC/ DNC communities and less than 35% of total marks, in the case of SC/SCA/ST communities shall not be considered for counselling.</b> For Service candidates, the minimum eligibility marks for admission to counselling will be 35% of total marks for all communities.</p>
24.	<p>In case more than one candidate has secured the same marks the tie shall be resolved / Inter se merit may be arrived on the basis of the following factors in the order of priority.</p> <p>(i) Total marks obtained in Final B.N.Y.S / N.D (Osm)</p> <p>(ii) Seniority in age will be given preference</p>

25.	The number of seats may be changed without notice. However, the exact distribution of seats, Specialty wise will be displayed on the notice board at the Directorate of Indian Medicine and Homoeopathy before the commencement of counselling.
26.	The selection will be made by counselling based on Rank list and by applying the 69% Rule of Reservation method followed by the Government of Tamil Nadu.
27.	The 69% Rule of Reservation is Applicable wherever there are eight seats and more in each discipline.
28.	50% of seats in each specialty and in each college are reserved for service candidates, in addition to those service candidates selected in the Open Category. In case an odd number seat remains in any specialty in the total seats sanctioned for that specialty, that seat shall be allotted to Open Category and will be filled based on Merit and Communal rotation.
29.	<p>Rule of Reservation will be followed as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Open competition: 31%</li> <li>• Backward Classes: 30%</li> <li>• Most Backward/ Denotified Communities: 20%</li> <li>• Scheduled Caste: 18%</li> <li>• Scheduled Tribe: 1 %</li> </ul> <p>Within the 30% reservation for Backward Classes, 3.5% reservation will be provided for Muslims. Within the 18% reservation for Scheduled Castes 16% out of 18% reservation will be provided for S.C.Arunthathiyars (SCA).</p>
30.	Any remaining unfilled seats for want of adequate number of eligible candidates belonging to SCA communities shall be filled by candidates belonging to SC community other than Arunthathiyars as per merit and vice versa without exceeding the quota for SC community as a whole.
31.	Any remaining reserved seats in ST quota for want of adequate number of eligible candidates belonging to ST community shall be allotted to candidates belonging to SC community as per merit without exceeding the quota for SC and ST community as a whole.
32.	Any remaining unfilled seats in BCM Community for want of adequate number of eligible candidates after exhausting the merit list shall be filled up on merit basis by candidates belonging to BC community without exceeding the quota for BC community as a whole.

33.	Candidates will be allowed to choose their Branch of Study at the time of Counselling subject to the availability of vacancy in that branch in the college, when the candidate gets his / her turn. Branch once opted and allotted at the time of Counselling shall be final and will not be allowed to change subsequently under any circumstances. Similarly, no transfer from one branch to another branch will be allowed during the course period of 3 years.
34.	All the candidates before participating in the counseling shall have to remit a non-refundable amount of <b>Rs.1000/- (Rupees One Thousand only)</b> by <b>CASH</b> as <b>processing fee</b> for conducting counseling. All Selected candidates shall make a non-refundable fee deposit of a sum of <b>Rs.5,000/- (Rupees Five thousand only)</b> by <b>CASH</b> at the time of receiving their formal allotment orders. No allotment order will be issued if payment is not made immediately and the seat will be allotted to the next meritorious candidate. After receipt of the joining report from the Principal of the Government Yoga and Naturopathy Medical College/ Institution, this amount will be transferred to the college and it will be adjusted in the tuition fees payable by the candidate. If the candidate fails to join the course within the stipulated time / date after getting allotment order he / she shall forfeit this amount and any other payments done by him / her and also loose right to join the current session of the M.D. (Yoga & Naturopathy) Programme.
35.	The Post Graduate Degree M.D. (Yoga & Naturopathy) courses admissions for 2023-2024 session will close on the cutoff date of admission as prescribed by the Ministry of Ayush, Government of India, Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University for the academic year 2023-2024.
36.	Candidates who have joined a Post-Graduate Degree M.D. (Yoga & Naturopathy) Course in any discipline and have discontinued the course on any grounds after the cut-off date, are not eligible to apply for two subsequent academic years of any discipline in Post Graduate degree Course. Further the candidate shall be considered as discontinued and should pay the Discontinuation Fee as per this prospectus.

37.	The candidates who join Post Graduate Degree course should not indulge in any kind of agitation / strike / ragging activity inside / outside the college campus during the course of study. Candidates found to take part in any such activities mentioned above will be expelled from the course/college at any point during the course of study and criminal action will be taken against them.
