1. **Application for Admission to Post Graduate courses in HOMOEOPATHY 2024-2025 session under “SEATS SURRENDERED TO GOVERNMENT” Quota at Sarada Krishna Homoeopathic Medical College, Kulasekaram, Kanyakumari - 629 161 (a Self-Financing Linguistic Minority Institution), White Memorial Homoeopathic Medical College, Attoor, Kanyakumari - 629 177 (a Self-Financing Religious Minority Institution) and Maria Homoeopathic Medical College, Thiruvattar, Kanyakumari - 629 177 can be downloaded from the website www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in. Also candidates are advised to read the Prospectus carefully before filling the Application form. No correspondence / request for re-consideration will be entertained.**
2. **Any change or modification and relevant information pertaining to this Admission Process will be made available on the website www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in**
3. **The candidates are instructed to visit the Website at least two times a day for updates from the date of issue of Application till the end of Admission process without fail. Selection Committee will not be responsible for consequences resulting due to non-diligent follow-up of Notices, Notification and Publications appearing on the Website regarding Admission to Post Graduate Degree courses in M.D. (Homoeopathy) 2024-2025 session.**
4. **Candidates are advised to read the Information Bulletin for AIAPGET - 2024 (HOMOEOPATHY) issued by National Testing Agency (NTA) carefully and visit the website www.ntaaiapget.nic.in for detailed qualifying criteria for admission to Post Graduate Degree in M.D. (Homoeopathy) 2024-2025 session.**

6. **APPLICATION FORM COST**

Candidates should submit their downloaded duly filled in application form with all enclosures along with the details regarding the SBI collect transaction and the original receipt of Rs. 3000/- towards the cost of application form. The procedure of online payment is mentioned in Clause 42 of this prospectus.

7. **PAYMENT OF COURSE FEE DEPOSIT:**

The candidates who are selected at the time of counseling shall remit a non-refundable sum of **Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only)** by Cash / Demand Draft (DD in favour of the Director, Indian Medicine and Homoeopathy Department, Chennai 600 106) only, at the time of receipt of the Allotment orders. After the conduct of the Registration Sub-committee meeting by the Tamil Nadu Dr. MGR Medical University, this amount will be transferred to the Colleges to get adjusted with the Tuition Fees to be payable by the candidates. If the candidate fails to join the course after getting allotment order within the stipulated time, he/she will forfeit this amount as well as seat allotted.

8. **COUNSELLING PROCESSING FEES:**

All Candidates who participate in the Post Graduate M.D. (Homoeopathy) Counselling will have to remit a non-refundable amount of **Rs.1000/- (Rupees One Thousand only)** as Cash towards Processing fee for attending Counselling.

9. **The candidates allotted to M.D. (Homoeopathy) course through Selection Committee, Directorate of Indian Medicine, and Homoeopathy, Arumbakkam, Chennai, will alone be registered for M.D. (Homoeopathy) Course in The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University.**

I. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. Before filling up of the Downloaded Application Form in the Prescribed format the Applicant should carefully read all the instructions given in Prospectus and Application form.
2. Fill the Application form carefully and legibly without overwriting and in one's own hand writing. All pages in the Application should be signed in full by the Applicant. Except with regard to those candidates who have studied from 8th Standard Onwards and have undergone undergraduate course (B.H.M.S.) in Tamil Nadu, others seeking Admission should furnish Nativity Certificate in the Format as in **Annexure – I**.
3. All enclosures prescribed should be Self – Attested true photocopies only. The Originals should be produced only at the time of Counselling and Admission.
4. Application with incomplete or insufficient particulars or without enclosures or those received after the last date mentioned will be summarily rejected. Further, request for extension of time for submission of documents beyond the prescribed date and time shall not be entertained under any circumstances.
5. Applications received by speed post, courier or any other means after the last date and time will not be accepted irrespective of the date of booking.
6. Non-service candidates should send their applications directly to the Secretary, Selection Committee Office, Directorate of Indian Medicine & Homoeopathy, Chennai – 600 106.
7. Service candidates should forward their application only through the proper channel with the remarks of the forwarding authorities in the format prescribed in the Application form. It should compulsorily reach on or before the last date as mentioned above. If not, Applications will be summarily rejected irrespective of the date of submission by the Applicant and date of forwarding by the competent authority. Advance copies from the service candidates will not be accepted.
8. A Self attested passport size Photograph should be affixed in the front page of the Application form in the space provided. The Photograph should be identical to the photograph attached in AIAPGET 2024 (HOMOEOPATHY) Hall Ticket.

9. If a candidate desires an immediate acknowledgement, should advise the postal or courier service and pay the required fees themselves. Acknowledgement Card confirming receipt of application with required particulars (Application Registration Number) will be sent subsequently to candidates who are found to be prima facie eligible if sufficient time is available before Counselling or else the candidate may visit the website for Eligible Applicants list.
10. All information pertaining to M.D. (HOMOEOPATHY) admission will be notified in the Department's official website www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in from time to time. Candidates are advised to check / visit the website minimum twice daily for PG Merit List, the Counselling Schedule, any further information / intimations etc., The Selection Committee will not be held responsible, if any candidate failed to appear in the Counselling. No individual correspondence in this regard shall be entertained.
11. No reservation for Persons with Bench Mark Disability is there in Self Financing Colleges.
12. In case of unauthorized absence of candidate for one month or more after getting admitted to the course, the candidate will be treated as having discontinued without notice and the vacancy will be filled up from the waiting list depending on the availability of time before the prescribed cut-off date. Candidates will have to give a declaration to this effect at the time of Admission.(As in Annexure – IV)
13. Those service candidates selected by **TNPSC / MRB** who have put in **less than two years** of continuous regular service as on **31.07.2024** will be treated as Non-Service candidates.
14. All others who have put in less than two years of service or who are probationers in Central Government, Public Sector Undertaking, Central Government Health Scheme (CGHS), Local bodies, National Rural Health Mission and Municipalities in Tamil Nadu and Tamil Nadu Government undertakings and organizations will be treated as Non-Service candidates.

15. **ALLOTMENT OF SEATS:**

The Selection Committee will allot seats to the Colleges and Branches of study based on the merit and following 69% rule of reservation or 200 points roster depending upon the seat matrices provided by the affiliating University and subject to the availability of seats at the time of individual's turn.

Apportionment of seats between the Government and Management of Self Financing Minority Institutions is in the ratio of 50:50 of the 85% of the sanctioned strength of seats after surrendering 15% of the sanctioned strength of seats towards All India Quota (AIQ).

Apportionment of seats between the Government and Management of Self-Financing Non-Minority Institutions is in the ratio of 65:35 of the 85% of the Sanctioned strength of seats after surrendering 15% of the sanctioned strength of seats towards All India Quota (AIQ).

16. **II. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO M.D. (HOMOEOPATHY) COURSE UNDER GOVERNMENT SURRENDERED SEATS.**

i) A person holding the degree of:

Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and surgery or equivalent qualification in Homoeopathy included in the schedule to the Act, after undergoing a course of study of not less than five years and six months duration including one year compulsory internship;

ii) The candidate enrolled in Central Register of Homoeopathy or Tamil Nadu Homoeopathy Medical Council shall be eligible for admission in the Post – Graduate courses, with successful completion of CRRI before the date fixed by NCH / AIAPGET Homoeopathy 2024.

iii) The candidates should fulfil the eligibility criteria for applying AIAPGET 2024 and should have obtain minimum of marks at 50th percentile in the ‘All India AYUSH Post Graduate Entrance Test (AIAPGET)’ held for the year 2024. Provided that in respect of candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Castes (Arunthathiyar), Scheduled Tribes, Most Backward Classes and Denotified Community, Backward Classes (Muslim) and Backward Classes; the minimum marks shall be at 40th percentile; for candidates with benchmark disabilities specified under the Rights of persons with disabilities Act, 2016, the minimum marks shall be at 45th percentile for the General Category and 40th percentile for the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Most Backward Classes and Denotified Community, Backward Classes (Muslim) and Backward Classes.

Note: Provided further that when sufficient number of candidates in the respective categories fail to secure minimum marks in the AIAPGET 2024, as specified above, held for 2024 academic year for admission to Post – Graduate courses, the Central Government in consultation with the council may at its discretion lower the minimum marks required for admission to Post – Graduate course for candidates belonging to respective categories and marks so lowered by the Central Government shall be applicable for that academic year only.

17. **At the time of counselling, candidate should produce the original documents such as the II Provisional Certificate or Degree Certificate from the recognized University and Medical Registration Certificate** issued by NCH / Tamil Nadu Homoeopathy Medical Council, Chennai.
18. The Candidate should be a Citizen of India and should have undergone B.H.M.S. Course in the State of Tamil Nadu. Candidates of Tamil Nadu nativity who have completed B.H.M.S. Course in other States shall furnish a Certificate of Nativity in Tamil Nadu issued by a competent authority only in the specified format prescribed in the application (See Annexure – I) and should also produce the Eligibility Certificate from The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University before Counseling or before attending the Counseling failing which they will not be considered for Selection.
19. Hall Ticket Roll Number and Marks scored in AIAPGET – 2024 (Homoeopathy) are to be filled in the relevant columns of the Application Form. Only Photostat Self Attested copies of the Hall Ticket and Marks Statement should be enclosed with the Application Form. Original Hall Ticket and Marks Statement must be produced only at the time of Counseling and Admission.
20. **NOT ELIGIBLE**
 - (i) Candidates who join a Post Graduate Degree in any branch and discontinue the course on any grounds after the cutoff date fixed by NCH **are not eligible to apply for two subsequent academic years.**
 - (ii) Candidates who have completed a Post Graduate Degree or the candidates who possess a Post Graduate Degree in one Specialty / Branch of study **are not eligible to apply for admission to any other Post Graduate degree i.e., in other branches.**
 - (iii) List of Candidates given as **NOT Eligible to attend counselling by AYUSH Admissions Central Counselling Committee (AACCC) from time to time.**

III. MODE OF SELECTION AND ADMISSION

21.
 - i) For non – Service Candidates:
Admission to the course will be made purely on merit, based on the marks obtained in the AIAPGET 2024 (Homoeopathy).
 - ii) For Service Candidates:

The State Rank list will be drawn based on marks obtained in AIAPGET 2024 (Homoeopathy) and additional weightage marks awarded to eligible in-service candidates. One mark will be awarded for each completed year of Government Service. Two marks will be awarded for each completed year of Government Service in Hill areas and it will be limited to maximum of 10 marks.

22. **DECLARATION OF MERIT LIST**

For non – service candidates merit will be arrived based on the marks obtained in the AIAPGET 2024 (Homoeopathy). For service candidates merit will be arrived as mentioned in clause 21(ii).

23. Tentative rank list will be published in the official website www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in after completion of scrutiny of all application received for the academic year 2024-2025.

IV. COUNSELLING

24. Personal appearance during counselling along with all original certificates / documents is compulsory for all eligible candidates applying for admission to the Post-Graduate courses to verify identity with reference to the attested copies enclosed with the Application. The candidates will be called as per Rank in Merit list **and the seats will be filled as per Rank in Merit list and communal reservation.**

In any case candidates without original certificates / documents who attended first phase counselling, shall **NOT** be allowed to participate in second or subsequent phases of counselling. No separate letter for counselling will be issued. **Candidates who are absent at the time of Counselling will not be considered for selection and no protest will be admitted in this regard.**

25. If any vacancy arises in Phase I, the seats will be filled in Phase II as per the Rank in merit list and communal reservation. Candidates who were absent in Phase I or who have not joined the allotted course in Phase I will not be permitted in Phase II.
26. Candidate can opt **for waiting list only for the speciality and not the College.** The candidate **cannot claim the seat which was present during Phase I during his / her turn, in subsequent phases.**

27. In case more than one candidate has secured the same number of marks the tie shall be resolved / inter se merit may be arrived on the basis of Rank obtained in the AIAPGET 2024 (HOMOEOPATHY)

28. **The number of seats may be changed without notice based on seat matrices provided by the Affiliating University. The Tentative seat apportionment for the academic year 2024-2025 is as follows;**

Medical University for the academic year 2024-2025.
32. The candidates who join Post Graduate Degree course should not indulge in any kind of agitation / strike / ragging activity inside / outside the college campus during the course of study. Candidates found to take part in any such activities mentioned above will be expelled from the course / college at any part of the course of study and criminal action will be taken against them.

V. DEFINITION OF SERVICE & NON-SERVICE CANDIDATES

33. SERVICE CANDIDATES

The following categories of Homoeopathy Medical Graduates only will be treated as Service candidates and considered for selection against 50% of seats reserved exclusively for service candidates.

(i) Homoeopathy Medical Graduates who were selected by the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission / Medical Services Recruitment Board and appointed in the Tamil Nadu Medical Service on regular basis, who have put in minimum of TWO years satisfactory and continuous service excluding leave period such as Earned Leave, Unearned Leave on Medical Certificate, Unearned Leave on Private Affairs, Maternity Leave and any other unauthorized absence, as on **31.07.2024** either in Tamil Nadu Medical Service or local bodies and organizations. Candidates above 50 years as on **31.07.2024** are not eligible to apply.

(ii) Homoeopathy Medical Graduates who are approved Probationers and who are working.

a. As Medical Officers working (continuously for two years) in Local Bodies in Tamil Nadu. A doctor absorbed from the Panchayat Union into Government Service as per G.O. Ms. No. 435 / Health and Family Welfare (IMI-2) Department, dated: 23-11-2000 will be considered as Service Candidates provided that they should have completed 2 years of service.

b. In Government of India Institutions in the State.

c. In Public Sector Undertaking and Organizations under the Control of

Government of India in Tamil Nadu.

d. An undertaking or organization of Government of Tamil Nadu.

34. The candidates under Clause 33, sub clause (ii) item (a) to (d) above should give an undertaking to the concerned authorities that they will serve for 5 years in the respective institutions after the completion of course. They should produce a certificate from the concerned authority to show that they have given such an undertaking.

35. **NON-SERVICE CANDIDATES**

The following categories of Homoeopathy Medical Graduates will be treated as Non- Service Candidates.

- (c) Private Registered Medical Practitioners.
